Panagiotis Dafiotis is a practising artist and teacher. He gained his practice-led PhD in 2011 from the Institute of Education. In 'Art practice as a form of research in art education' (2013) – Dafiotis' contribution to Addison and Burgess' Debates in Art and Design Education – he proposes a 'hybrid field in which the hierarchical questions, for example between teacher and learner, word and image, are questioned and the voices of students legitimised' (p. 141).

Drawing on Deleuze and Guattari – particularly their notions of the 'rhizome' and 'smooth space' – his practice-based research explores 'art making as a meta-process in which making about making becomes a way of thinking about thinking' (Dafiotis, 2011). His quest is to 'create a space where participants can revisit their own assumptions and reflect on them'.
